



Grades 12 & College

The Party addresses the issues associated with consent, sexual coercion, and assault. Audiences will witness a deep look into the very real stories that occur on college campuses and learn about the power and necessity of consent.

Major Learning Points:

- Define sexual assault
- Defining consent
- Learn how to stay safe on campus
- Understand what coercive behavior is and looks like
- How to be safe at a party
- How to feel safe after an assault

Post-Performance Discussion:

Following the performance, the actors/educators moderate an interactive discussion to help reinforce the educational points of the play.

Tip: We recommend not showing this play at the end of a day, on a Friday or before a school break. It is impactful and we want kids to be able to talk to guidance counselors if it triggers anything or brings on any epiphanies about their own lives or relationships.

Performance Logistics:

- Recommended maximum audience size is 300
- Program approximately one hour (includes show and discussion)
- 3 Lavalier microphones or 3 wireless microphones on thin metal stands
- Staff available to actors 30 minutes prior to performance and throughout the program

Additional Information:

A \$150 non-refundable deposit is due with the signed contract. Sponsors book travel arrangements for actors. If sponsor chooses to have DET make travel arrangements all travel costs must be paid in full 60 days prior to the show date. DET accepts checks, credit cards and purchase orders as form of payment.
